**Albuquerque** – The New Mexico Citizen Redistricting Committee (CRC) is in the midst of public forums for the purpose of soliciting input on factors the committee should consider when developing Congressional, legislative and locally elected districts. The public also has an opportunity to create and submit maps for local, regional, or statewide districts. A significant element of the redistricting process is demographic data which is scheduled to be released on Thursday by the United States Census Bureau.

In the midst of CRC hearings and in advance of the Census Bureau releasing the decennial census data, New Mexico First is a hosting a briefing just for New Mexico media. Expert speakers include representatives from the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL), which has hosted numerous local and national briefings over the past two years on the basics of redistricting and practical instruction, and the Redistricting Lab, which helped to set up the CRC's public input web portal.

The briefing will begin with an introduction by New Mexico First's Interim President and Executive Director, Michael Barndollar, and CRC Chair Justice Ed Chavez (invited).

The experts will share some insights, key indicators, and the type of questions to ask, and potential Census data shifts to look for and the current process. In addition, there will be a Q&A with Underhill and Williams.
